Plan Updates:

<u>Daily schedule</u> - Please check Skyward for your daily schedule. Please note that on Friday, teachers will have 2 hours of office hours. A list of teachers' office hours will be available on Sunday.

<u>Instructional time</u> - No more than 20 minutes per class with no more than 60 minutes to complete the tasks and homework.

<u>Attendance</u> - Advisory teachers will take daily attendance. Students need to check in with their advisor by 1:00 pm each day, Monday through Friday.

<u>Student belongings at MSA</u> - Please call the main MSA phone line (651-578-7507) if you need to pick up materials. Entrance into the school building is by appointment only.

<u>Student Behavior During Distance Learning</u> - Behavior and clothing expectations while conducting online learning and/or communicating with staff are still in effect.

AP/ACT/MCA Testing

- MCAs at MSA will not occur this year.
- ACT exams will not occur at MSA this year. Please continue to monitor this page and your email

- Traditional face-to-face AP exam administrations will not take place.
- For each AP subject, there will be 2 different testing dates.
- The full exam schedule, specific free-response question types that will be on each AP Exam, and additional testing details will be available by April 3rd.
- For the 2019–20 exam administration only, students can take a 45-minute online exam at home.
- To be fair to all students, some of whom have lost more instructional time than others, the exam will only include topics and skills most AP teachers and students have already covered in class by early March.

- Students will be able to take these streamlined exams on any device they have access to—computer, tablet, or smartphone. Taking a photo of handwritten work will also be an option.

IEP/504 Plans

- Paraprofessionals will host live/synchronous classroom sessions for students with IEPs using this schedule.
- Students will receive special education IEP service minutes.
- Individualized Google Classrooms for each student on an IEP have been created. Each student's teachers, EAs and related service providers who will be working with them are in this group.
