

Dear MSA 6th, 7th, and 8th Grade Parents:

Your child has the opportunity to participate in **MSA Battle of the Books**, which is an opportunity to read great books, discuss them with team members, and experience reading as a “team sport.” The live Battle will be in February, and parents/families/coaches are invited to watch. There is no cost to participate in this program, and it is open to all 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students.

There are eight Battle books (same books for all grades), which are available for check-out in Mr. Fillbrandt’s (6th grade English) room. *[Due to limited copies of the books, students can only check out one Battle book at a time!]* Each grade is broken up into several teams of ~4-6 team members. Since this is a “team effort,” each team member should **plan to read four or more** of the Battle books over the next few months. Teams will meet with a volunteer coach during the school day (Friday’s study hall) at least once each month to discuss the books and prepare for the Battle.

The Battle of the Books competition will be held at **MSA on Friday, February 1st during advisory/study hall.**

There will be the following prizes:

- * If a student reads all 8 books, the student is invited to an ice cream social (immediately after the Battle).
- * If a team wins the actual Battle, the team wins a pizza lunch (at a following date)!

Before signing this permission slip, **please discuss with your child the importance of following through when making a commitment.** If your child signs up for a team and then drops out, it leaves the former teammates at a disadvantage. This is very important!

Sign up procedure: Students may request teammates of their choice on their permission slip, and we will *try* our best to assign them their choices (no guarantees). Teams will meet during study hall periods on Fridays. A “Meet Your Team” meeting will be scheduled on Friday, November 2nd during study hall. Please watch for announcements in the daily emails on upcoming dates and information.

Students will not be assigned to a team unless their permission slip is returned.
