- Part of the Annual Report for the State
 - Must publish a summary report and share electronically
 - Must hold an annual public meeting
 - Tonight is that annual meeting

- Must satisfy State legislation to address the following 5 goals:
 - All children are ready for school.
 - All third-graders can read at grade level.
 - All racial and economic achievement gaps between students are closed.
 - All students are ready for career and college.
 - All students graduate from high school.

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

We are pleased with our Multiple Measurement Ratings (MMR) scores. Of particular note, our MMR increased by over 23% from 2012. And growth points and gap points increased from last year. Our graduation rate continues to be 100%.

2014 – 2015 Goals and Results

Goals

- MSA will increase the combined percentage of "high growth" and "medium growth" from 73.3% to 78% in Math as calculated in the MMR data.
- MSA will increase the combined percentage of "high growth" and "medium growth" from 80.7% to 83% in Reading as calculated in the MMR data.
- The average ACT score of graduating seniors will meet or exceed a composite score of 28.
- 100% of students who begin their senior year at MSA will meet minimum requirements to graduate on time.

Results

- MSA had 41.9% in "high growth", and 44.9% in "medium growth" for a combined total of 85.8% in Math.
- MSA had 42.2% in "high growth", and 40.5% in "medium growth" for a combined total of 82.7% in Math.
- MSA's graduating seniors had an average composite ACT score of 28.8
- 100 % of MSA students who began their senior year at MSA graduated on time.

2015 – 2016 Goals

Goals

- MSA will identify ELL students attending MSA for future goal settings.
 - There were no identified ELL students noted last year.
- MSA will maintain its current combined level of reading (83%) and math (85%) as determined by MMR data.
- The average ACT score of graduating seniors will meet or exceed a composite score of 28.
- 100% of students who begin their senior year at MSA will meet minimum requirements to graduate on time.



Systems, Strategies, and Support

- Monthly staff meetings to identify students who might be struggling.
- All Juniors are individually counseled on academic progress.
- Each department has curriculum maps that identify skills, assessments and resources utilized in each unit of study.
- Departments are meeting to enhance crosscurricular opportunities.
- Math Department presented their scope and sequence, answered questions, and invited feedback to parents and community members on November 9.
- Science Department will present on February 29th.
- ELL position created for 2nd Semester.
